

Making Disciples

One thing that Christians fail miserably at is in the area of discipleship. They fail to disciple new Christians, probably because they were never discipled themselves. When you disciple someone, you take them under your wing and show them how to live a Christian life. You don't teach them. You show them. The byproduct of watching you, is that they inherently learn, but you are not


to become their teacher. You are to be their example. It is necessary to Disciple the brethren.

A soul winning church that does not make disciples, ends up like the first Jerusalem church. They stay at home and don't go out to do anything. Only 1% of Christians today

make one disciple. Why is it that we are dragging our feet in this area? I believe it is because churches are not aware of the importance of discipleship. Is you look at most churches, their entire discipleship program is contained in a series of 10 or 12 targeted sermons. A new convert is taught that once they have gone through the classes, that they have been disciplined. Unfortunately, a ten step program of discipleship will not do it. It really takes a lifetime. Nor does going through a little booklet make person a disciple of Jesus Christ.

2 Timothy 2:2 says, "And the things that thou hast heard of me among many witnesses, the same commit thou to faithful men, who shall be able to teach others also."

The first thing that needs to be done to make a disciple is to take them into your house and treat them like a son or daughter. This means that you need to be willing to take someone under your wing and let them see

who you are. They need to be close to you. They need to see your life and how you live it for Christ. You have to give people your time. There is nothing more important than to disciple someone. Jesus' disciples were always with him. They went every where He went. He deposited His life into them. We need to deposit our life into those who we disciple.

2 Timothy 2:3 says, "Thou therefore endure hardness, as a good soldier of Jesus Christ."

Some of our soldiers are pitiful. We can't even show up on time, can't be faithful in giving, praying, or even attending church. When you lose the aggression to be a soldier of Jesus Christ, then you lost it. Young converts are watching you to see how to live the Christian life and they will emulate you. You don't want them to be anemic, unfit soldiers. You want to teach young men and women of God to be soldiers of the Lord. We don't have any option in this. We have to multiply our-

The Rest of the News:

1) So far there has been nothing but positive reports from New Zealand since we left. Bro. Dave Withingtyon has done a fine job filling in for me – the people have been faithful and all have jumped in to do their part in our absence. Their first big test took place four days after our departure when an older lady in the church (Pauline) fell and broke her pelvis in three places. The whole church has rallied around with visits to the hospital and help for the family. **Please pray** for Pauline's recovery and for her husband Mike who is on the verge of losing his sight unless God steps in for him.

2) In the month and weeks up to our departure we saw a number of blessings – several visitors (including three young families) have been along including some who have said they are looking for a new church. In many cases, such folks have a long list of doctrinal baggage from other denominations that can take years to work through – in NZ this will most often involve Pentecostal/Charismatic issues that are insurmountable for all but those few who are truly interested in obeying what the Bible actually says. **Please pray** for God's will with these new

families and for Dave who has his work cut out for him at the moment!

Bro. Dave works a full time job driving a forklift as well as now filling in for me as pastor at Timaru BBC for these next 5 months. His wife TeAni is due with their fourth child in October. The church in Timaru is paying its bills, but is not quite at the point of being able to help him out in any substantive manner. Deb and I are sending some extra funds their way each month while on furlough, but if anyone else feels led of the Lord to help this brother and his wife out with a one-time love gift, their address is at the end of this letter.

3) In the weeks leading up to furlough, I taught the folks in Timaru a series on evangelism and how to lead people to Christ. We were thoroughly "rapt" to see many of the people in church pass out their first tract and/or to engage in their first verbal witness with someone. Testimony time in church was a blessing as the folks testified about how God gave them the courage to make these first attempts. **Please pray** that God will honour their faithfulness with some visible fruit. Our prayer is that the church will see some souls saved and new members added while we are here in the USA – the folks in Timaru need to see that it is God that grows his church and not the missionary!

Deb and I have already been blessed in catching up with some of you – Lord willing over the next few months this number will only increase. We have had some neat opportunities to pass out tracts at a lobster festival and to go out with our home church street preaching. Your prayers continue to be a blessing as we still have many miles ahead of us. Thanks so much for all that you do for our family and the cause of Christ down under!

selves. We have to turn them into soldiers. The kind that are not intimidated by every Muslim that walks by.

I am reminded of a story that I read in Memoirs of a twentieth century circuit riding preacher, by Peter Ruckman. There was a group out street preaching one evening and with them was a 17 year old girl. As the preachers preached from the back of a pickup truck, she was standing on the sidewalk passing out tracts and witnessing. Along came a biker whom she confronted with the gospel. He got so mad at her that he pulled out a switchblade and put it to her throat saying, "If you say one more thing to me about God, I'm going to kill you." She stepped back about 6" and put a tract on the end of his blade saying, "Here read this then." Now that is the kind of soldier who is not ashamed of Jesus Christ. Where are the Christians like that today? They are not there because they have not been disciplined.

2 Timothy 2:4 says, "No man that warreth entangleth himself with the affairs of this life; that he may please him who hath chosen him to be a soldier."

Christians need to be careful to not get entangled with the things of the world. If we are entangled up in things, then we cant please Him; we can't function. Too many Christians are all tangled up looking for their calling. They are looking for a church or God that will "fit them" and their personality. It used to be that Christians went "church hopping" looking for the right church for them. Nowadays people go "religion hopping" to see which one allows them the most latitude to do the things they want to do. Friends, God has already chosen our vocation--it is being a soldier. We are not to waste time getting all tangled up in denominational, religious, church webs. Satan has woven them to entrap you so that you will be an ineffective soldier.

2 Timothy 2:5 says, "And if a man also strive for masteries, yet is he not crowned, except he strive lawfully."

Disciples need to be taught how to strive for masteries. This is lacking in today's Christians because they were never taught themselves. Everybody is waiting for the pastors or deacons to do everything because they have not been

Hello Pastors and Friends,

July & August 2014

It has been an exciting summer for our ministries. This summer we have started going to two more areas for soul-winning. Every Sunday afternoon after Children's Ministry we have about twenty-five people that go to Tuol Kork for soul-winning and tract distribution. Lord willing in 2015 we would like to start a new church plant in that area. Also, we have started going to two neighboring villages called Krang Pong Ro and Krang Svay every Saturday morning. Marady and his family (very faithful members of our church) live in Krang Pong Ro. We have already started a Children's Ministry in Krang Svay. My son, Justin, and two other young ladies are overseeing that ministry. **Please pray that in the future we can start a church in these villages.**

Sophanny has been saved and faithfully attending our church in Prek Bang for about three months now. She was invited by her friend, Tiero, and after a couple of weeks of attending church, my wife was able to lead her to Christ. Because of her good testimony her family is open to the Gospel. Recently, after two of our men witnessed to her mom, Sokunthy, she also made a profession of faith. Now Sokunthy encourages her other children to attend church with Sophanny.

We are very excited to report that so far this year we have had several Cham folks who have made a profession of faith. One of the believers is Phalley who is the daughter of Hem and Som. We have been praying for her for about three years and we are thankful that she has finally trusted Christ as her Saviour. She was also one of several folks who were baptized recently. Sane, Ra, and Sas were the other Cham believers who also got baptized recently. Please pray for our Cham people. When they get saved and start living for God, they receive heavy persecution from family members and neighbors.

Since Sane started living for God about two months ago, I have been discipling him along with his parents, Hem and Som. It is a joy and a blessing to see the three of them together learning and hungering for the Word of God. Please pray for Hem and Som's oldest son who lives in South Korea, as he is the only one that is not yet saved in this family. Som was the first one in the family to get saved, and I have never seen a person who has been more blessed than her the past two years. She is very faithful in being a witness for God to her Cham people even though she constantly receives persecution.

Please also pray for these other new converts: Saony, Dy, four children in Kun Dung Thom, three teenagers in ThaSkor, and four teenagers in Thourm Vteng Thmar. We thank the Lord also that two weeks ago, we had twelve people that got baptized.



given a job to strive at. You cannot achieve if you don't accomplish, and you can never accomplish anything if you are not involved in doing something. Every member of a church should have some kind of job to do. When they go out into the world to stand by themselves, no one will be there to teach them the discipline that a Christian needs to live by. The discipline has gone out of the window in today's churches. Christian children are addicted. If you want to see how much, just take their electronics away and see how they react. When Christians go to the field, they have to have initiative. They have to know how to make their own decisions for living a Christian life. Can he/she operate as a Christian by themselves? Can your child operate as a Christian by themselves? We need to teach them Christian discipline so they can strive lawfully.

2 Timothy 2:6 says, "The husbandman that laboreth must be first partaker of the fruits."

Discipled Christians need to be hard working people. They will never learn to do this if you are not. Farmers are hard working people. People from the farms are typically hard working people. People from the cities are typically not. We are too overprotected of our children in today's anemic church. Children are not even allowed to go through any pain, get sick or even break a bone. Listen! If they are going to survive in the world, they need to learn how to go through a little hardness. We make anemic Christians by protecting them too much. They need to learn how to farm. Children of today have smooth skin. They lack the hard skin that comes from endless blisters and callous'. All they have to do is push buttons and run to mommy and daddy at every little whim so they can get a little attention. They don't know how to bear a little hardship because they have never been taught to do so.

2 Timothy 2:15 says, "Study to shew thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth."

You have to teach them that they need to be approved unto GOD. Too many people today want to be approved by people. They thrive on reward and building of ego. If they don't get approval (positive reinforcement) then their life is shattered. Why? Because they were taught to be this way by the older generation of Christians whom they observed. They need to learn how to learn from God on their own. They need to know what it is to have their own quiet time. They need to learn how to interpret the Bible on their own.

When I was a boy living at home, I would ask my dad, "What's the meaning of this word...?" He always responded, "What did the dictionary say?" He was teaching me how to look up the meaning of words on my own. Likewise, we have to teach younger Christians how to use the Bible themselves.

2 Timothy 2:21 says, "If a man therefore purge himself from these, he shall be a vessel unto honour, sanctified, and meet for the master's use, and prepared unto every good work."

Disciples need to learn how to be a vessel unto honor. They need to know how to work and do things. You need to teach them things that you know. You never know who you would be training. You never know what they will do when they grow up. They need to be prepared unto every good work. They need to know how to be meet or prepared for the masters use. You don't know how the master will use them. It may be in construction, it may be in preaching.~
