We need real Dad's

Christian homes are failing because of the lack of leadership. Our homes need real Christian men who will lead their families and take responsibility for raising their children in the nurture and admonition of the Lord. We don't need "Rambo's" who will abuse their families. We need caring, steady men who are not ashamed of Jesus Christ. What is forgotten is that your children are learning. They will either learn how to be a sissified shameful representative for Christ, or they will learn how to "having done all, stand." And they are learning from you.

80% of their teachers are female. The vast majority of our Sunday school teachers are women. It is no wonder that our future men are turning out to be feminized weak sissy's. It's no wonder our future women are taking on a more manly, leadership role (they can't find any real men to lead). Dad's, you need to think about this real hard. God holds you responsible for the spiritual upbringing of your family. I do not think that we would have the social upheaval that we have today if dads the generation before us had took it to heart to lead their families.

All too often, our children are being raised by females only. They are around moms most of the time the men are at work.

Fight On!

The name of William "Red" Hill, Sr. is forever linked to the history of Niagra Falls. Hill was a genuine hero by any definition of the word. At the age of nine years old he was awarded a medal for bravery for rescuing a young girl from a burning house. His deeds of heroism in and around the Falls netted him three more medals over the years. He is credited with saving the lives of 28 people associated with Niagra Falls.

Serving in Europe during World War I Hill received two more medals for bravery. But, as a result of being gassed he was returned to Canada by 1918.

It was in that year that Hill performed one of his most daring rescues at the Falls. A barge carrying two crewmen had broken loose from its tow above the Falls and was quickly swept down river. Within sight of the edge of the Falls it grounded. Frantic attempts were made to save the men before the barge could be swept over the Falls. Finally a line was fired and secured to the barge but when a breeches buoy was sent out toward the barge the line tangled. It was dark when Hill rode the buoy out over the treacherous waters and tried to free the cable but to no avail. If the barge shifted while he was out there he would fall and be swept to his death. When daylight came Hill again volunteered to attempt to free the line. At 8 AM he went again. For an hour-and-a-half Hill wrestled with the tangled line. This time he was successful and the men were thankfully brought to shore. Red Hill, Sr. had left his mark on Niagra Falls again. **Fight on!**

Also, in August we flew to Denver to visit Jon and Sheila and to see our newest grandson, Rowan. Because of the way we live we don't see any of our grandchildren very often and actually miss being with them as they grow up. It was **so great** to be with Jon and Sheila and to see Evan & Rowan!

Kathy's sister, Jill, had brain surgery back in December and is still recovering slowly. Please keep her in prayer.

The Motor Home

We have finally given in and started shopping for a new RV. Most RVs get used only about 3 months per year. We use ours 12 months a year. Thus, in 5 years we put 20 years worth of twisting and turning on one and the structure starts to show it. Laminate breaks loose, panels separate and leaks appear. The engine, a big diesel Cummins, is never the issue. It can last for a million miles but the body of the RV can't make it much past five years. Getting structure repairs on an RV entails big bucks and leaving it weeks on end, leaving us to travel without the RV and repairs that we can't be sure are done right. Many times when we leave an area we don't return for several years. Thus, if the repairs aren't done right we end up canceling meetings while we get them done again or simply take the loss and get them done a second time somewhere else. (No. You don't have a better way to do this.)

We are not crazy about getting into the expense of a new RV but really have no recourse. The Lord has yet to tell me anything else to do so we are "In it for the long haul!"

Dear Praying Saints in Christ,

August, 2014

Serve the LORD with gladness: come before his presence with singing. Psalm 100:2

Thank you for your continual prayers and financial support! We hope you all are doing well and looking forward to the soon return of Jesus Christ. One thing that helps one keep looking for Jesus Christ to come is "laying up treasure in heaven." Everything a believer does for the Lord, including prayers and giving, counts as laying up treasure in heaven. Doing this helps one "set his affections on things above," as he should. One can more easily "serve the Lord with gladness," knowing that Jesus is coming soon to take him home, and that many loved ones, saved souls, and treasures are also awaiting him in heaven.

When one speaks of treasure, one can't help but think of what this world treasures most, money. (1 Tim. 6:10) However, every believer has found that there is a treasure on earth much more valuable than dollar bills, treasure which one can hold in his hands. No, I'm not talking about investing gold coins in a Swiss bank account. I'm referring to the priceless words of God. The scriptures are the most valuable treasure we have on earth (in God's book, at least). The God that so highly esteems his words (Psalm 138:2) refers to the treasure of this world as "filthy lucre." Investing God's treasure in eternity is the best way of "laying up treasure in heaven," according to the Bible. When Jesus came he could have given anything, yet he said, "the sower soweth the word." God's word will not return void.

We are glad to be in Brazil, "holding forth the word of life" (Phil 2:16) to the lost. Our public, street preaching ministry is going very well. I know that there are many different ministries and other good ways to "sow the word." However, there is no substitute for going out in the open, downtown, and showing folks that someone is not ashamed of the gospel of Christ. In our city of 250,000 inhabitants, from what I gather, no one had ever preached on the street here before us. That is shameful! We are glad to do it! My wife, Maggie and our children are also glad to have a part in it.

Our 14 month old, Esther, has gotten very good at sowing the word! When we go shopping, I always carry her in my arms. Arriving at the cash register, I cannot open my wallet without her, automatically, grabbing a tract and offering it to the cashier. Every one of them melts when she does this. No one has ever told her, "No." Yet, people are telling the Lord Jesus, "No," every day, when they put off getting saved.

Playing indoor soccer on weeknights has been a blessing. These people in southern Brazil are incredibly difficult to deal with. While outwardly they treat you like you are one of them, they inwardly treat you like you've got leprosy. I often wonder if they even trust their own father and mother. Bob Jones Sr. said, "The man who won't trust anybody is a thief at heart..." Sometimes, I think if I was a convicted murderer, a robber, or even worse, a politician, they might feel more comfortable around me (John 3:19-21). God only knows. Whatever the case, playing Brazil's national sport has really helped me get in contact with them and converse with them. Please pray for the salvation of two soccer players, Fabiano and Nilmar. Thank you for your prayers!

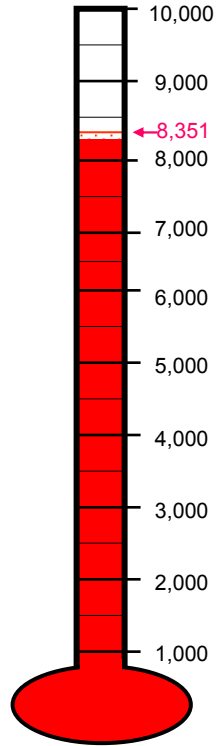
