Dear Pastors, Churches, and Friends, November 14, 2014

Thank you all for praying for us and for your financial support! God has been very good to us, as always, especially over the months of October and November. However, amidst the blessings, I must bring you some unpleasant news. I don't know why God is so good to me, likewise, I often do not know why he does some of the things he does, but I know that with God "...all things work together for good..." (Rom 8:28).

The unpleasant news I mentioned is that our family will soon be coming back to America, permanently. This, my decision, was a very difficult yet simple one to make. It is very difficult because we do not want to leave Brazil. We realize the many things we and the Brazilians will miss out on once we are gone. It is very sad to think about. However, the decision was very simple, due to the fact that God has made his will so clear to me. God's will, concerning this matter, is something that I have prayed over for about the last two years. During that time, I felt that the Lord would eventually have us leave Brazil. Fearing to step outside of God's will,

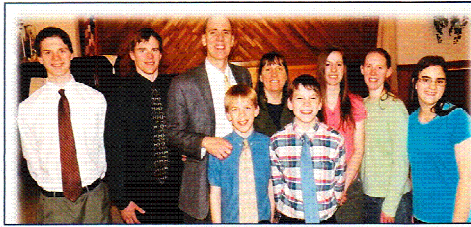
September and October 2014

I am amazed how God opens and shuts doors! The last year has been one shut door after another. We have spent much time in prayer and fasting seeking God's will for our family in Argentina. One thing we have been praying about is a church building.

I noticed a need in town for the Mapuche that came in from the surrounding communities to do their shopping. The stores are closed from 1:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. and the people and their family just hangout wherever they can find a place. I thought it would be good to offer services during this time, but we would need a building.



Three blocks from our house is an old, abandoned hotel/saloon made out of horse manure clay. The bedrooms have dirt floors but the main building looked like it would work for a church building. I kept this in the back of my mind as I prayed for God's guidance.

A week or so ago a couple of Nanci's friends were visiting and Lili was talking about some building that would be perfect for our family and she knew the owner. We hopped in the car and drove to the owner's house. It turned out the building she was talking about was the old hotel!

Mrs. Lobos, the owner, proposed that we fix the hotel for a break in the rent. After much prayer we agreed and Friday we plan on signing the contract for a church building.

Please pray with us as we move forward

- For safety as the family works on the building
- Wisdom on how to let the people of the country know about the services
- That many people would be reached and we would see much fruit
- God would provide the finances for the many things we need to buy to complete the building

We thank the Lord for a new place to serve in Corona, Ca. A place where we already have made some friends and have already seen some fruit for the glory of God.

We started our services 3 weeks and had a couple of families come out. In our 1st service we had a couple indicate they wanted to know more about salvation. That turned into a home visit that then turned into Discipleship classes. Antonio and Aurora is a young couple with a son named Maximo. Antonio has a ton of questions, I mean a TON! So he said to me on his 2nd visit to church that he has decided I will be his “guide”, since he believes I am dealing with him straightforwardly. I said, OK.

I was at the polls and met a lady whose last name was very typical of where we had served for the past 15 years. It led to a little talk and turns out she and her husband, Manuel, have lived in Corona for about a year and were looking for a Baptist church. Needless to say I offered her my tract and she was delighted. They came the very next Sunday, then last week they brought 2 visitors.

We also had a couple come in from our sign out front. That was blessing as they as well are looking for a Spanish speaking church in the area.

So on our 3rd Sunday we had 17 in church with 2 first time visitors. God is working and we are excited about the work the Lord is going to do in Corona.

Coming stateside has proved to be challenging to us. We are making adjustments to the flow of things. We have some cultural issues that are subtle to us, but I guess they sort of stick out to us. Finances have been a challenge, and the Lord is faithful. Liz was able to get a part time job that works from home and that will be a huge help. Genny went out looking for work and found a job quickly. We know it is of the Lord as the job market is so tough, yet within a week of looking both Liz and Genny found employment. Now they are teasing me and tell me I am the only one unemployed, but I told them I am the only one “really” employed and I have the best boss! We had a laugh over that.

So God is working, He is showing us His mighty hand and His faithfulness to provide, to guide and direct our lives for His glory.

We thank you for your continued prayers, your faithful and steadfast support for us. We ask that you keep our mothers in prayer, Juana and Eleanor. My mom, Eleanor has had 3 ER visits in just a few months, she has had a bladder infection and then 1 occasion she was unresponsive and apparently had a medication overdose. Evidently the doctor said her kidneys were dehydrated and stored her medication and upon drinking enough liquids, released the stored up medicines and they were too much for her. So she is drinking a lot more regularly.

by leaving Brazil too soon, my prayer became, "If so, Lord, when should we go?" Much time passed with no clear response from above. That is, until about one month ago when the Lord told me that the time had come to go back to America. Although God's answer was clear, the decision was not an easy one to make. You don't have to be a missionary to imagine how difficult that would be, to decide to come off the mission field, especially after 2 years

of deputation and 3 years spent on the field! It is something we have poured our whole lives and hearts into for over 5 years. So, trusting in the Lord, about two weeks ago we purchased our airplane tickets and are scheduled to arrive in Pensacola, Florida the first week of December.

God has blessed our family by having us meet specific people that have helped us find new homes for our stuff. William, age 24, adopted our dog. He has many co-workers who always seem to have room for more furniture and appliances. A few days after meeting him, I asked William what he does for a living. He said that he is an intermediary, who negotiates between banks and debtors who have not been making their payments, in short, to see that the debt gets paid off. He was surprised to hear that his job is just like the job of the Lord Jesus Christ, who helps sinners pay off their sin debt and, freely, brings them to the Father (1 Tim. 2:5; Jn 14:6). Being a lost Roman Catholic, this was just what William needed to hear. If he knew one thing, William knew that he was a sinner, who had offended God and had a debt he could not pay. He understood how that Christ already paid the debt, but that he was waiting for William to accept the payment that he made at Calvary. Thank God that after hearing the gospel he prayed and asked Jesus Christ to save him!!! After praying the sinner's prayer he lifted up his head with a smile and said, "I feel different, lighter." I, personally, can understand why he said that because, when Jesus Christ takes away one's burden of unforgiven sin, his blood "cleanseth us from ALL sin" (1 Jn 1:7; Isa. 1:18)!

As you could probably imagine, our departure will be bitter-sweet. It will be sweet, because although we are leaving, we are glad that we are leaving on good terms with God. It will be bitter, because neither Maggie or I want to leave Brazil. I know for a fact that we could stay in Brazil for however many more years and see many more Brazilian souls saved. However, if one knows that's not where God wants him, useful as he may be, one knows he is out of the will of God and that his Master would have him elsewhere. But don't think it isn't very tempting for me to stay in Brazil, against the Lord's will. Aside from the Lord, himself, who else would know? Knowing that you all care for us a great deal and pray for us constantly, I don't want you to be worried about us. As the apostle Paul said, "Do thyself no harm: for we are all here." In a situation when a missionary family comes off of the field, sometimes it is because something very bad happened. However, thankfully, that is NOT the case with us. Please let me make the record very clear: we are coming back to America, permanently, because I believe that God wants us to. That's it. Maggie and I are still happily married. All of our kids are still alive and well. We are not having problems with any brethren on the mission field or at home in America. Amen.

In closing, I can think of nothing more fitting to say than, Thank You!!! Thank you to all of you Pastors that allowed us to come in on deputation and continually reminded your members to pray for us! Thank you to churches and friends who, throughout good times and bad in your own lives, kept us in your prayers. Most of all, thanks be to God, who saved us and gave us the privilege to represent him for the last three years on the mission field of Brazil! Brethren, Thank you all, one last time! Know that we love you and appreciate all you have done!!

thankful for. If you meditate upon this for a few minutes, you can see that every time we thank somebody for something, we are in fact thanking the Lord because we are thanking His creation. BUT, you have to see God as the all powerful Creator and Sustainer of all things to see it.

As our Creator and Sustainer, God not only puts us here in this world to walk the path of life that we are on, but He keeps us as well. Without Him, there would be no food to eat, friends to associate with, or even a heart to beat. So, when we thank a doctor for prescribing us a life saving medication, we are actually expressing thanks to God for putting such a person in our life. God created him

too! He had him born on the earth, raised, trained and placed in that particular hospital you went to on that needful day. If you say, "Thank you doc," then you are in essence saying thank you to the Creator for arranging things in the manner He has, but many people don't think their expression of appreciation goes that deep--that far. This is because they do not consider the wonders of God and His creation.

When people don't think of God, they are misguiding or even perverting, something that God put in man to be used for a particular purpose to cause man to assume his designed role of imaging God. God did not create man so that man could live independent of Him. God wanted man to totally rely upon Him for everything. Nothing has changed. God still wants man to totally rely upon Him. What I am going to say next, you probably already know, but

may not have thought of it in this context before--No matter how much man thinks he is independent of God, he IS totally dependent upon Him every day of his life. Man just does not see that connection and therefore, man thinks that his thanks only goes as far as the ears that hear it first.

Man deals in levels of appreciation. Even the most evil of men still feel appreciation for something. He may appreciate that the robbery he just committed went off smoothly. He may appreciate that he was not caught and went to jail. This is misguided and perverted appreciation. The stingy man may feel appreciation for things, but to get him to express it may be like pulling teeth. Although difficult for

him to express, he may feel appreciation deep down in his heart. In fact, he may be appreciative that you never asked him something that he had to express thanks for. He wants to do everything for himself because he views expressing thanks as a type of bondage, and he doesn't want to owe you anything. This is a type of misguided and perverted thanks. The overly thankful person may not really be thankful at all for some of the things he professes to be thankful for. Expressions of thanks just spew out of his mouth and roll off his lips with little regard for what he is saying. He says thanks so much that the people around him get tired of hearing the words, especially when they see no actions to back up his appreciation. This too is a misguided and perverted thanks.

All of these fall on the ears of God indirectly, but not without great consideration by God for their sincerity. They all filter back to God because He is the creator and sustainer of all things (even hell and the Lake of Fire). If they fall upon His ears as appreciation that is perverted or misguided,

they mean very little to Him. At the same time, sincere thanks to Him or to others is a great blessing to Him because it shows our acknowledgment of Him as Creator and Sustainer. We may not have connected the dots in that truth yet, but they still acknowledge Him.

The next time you are in a store and someone asks you if you could help them get something down off of the top shelf, remember what happens to the appreciation they express.

Perverted or misguided thanks means very little to God.

Recall that it falls on the ears of God as if His Creation is acting within its designed purpose. Not to say the words "thanks," But to appreciate God's design. The design of sending you in that person's presence at exactly the precise time for

Him to use you to care for His creation. Then thank God for working it out for you to be there to help that person.

As with everything else, it all goes back to God. Show your appreciation to Him for using you for His will.~
