Several months ago Peter received Christ and started attending Independent Baptist Church of Mbarara. Peter has listened to Christian radio in his village and he has been around other Christian people. However, I am not sure which means God used to allow him to be saved. Whichever means by which Peter received Christ I think we would all praise God for his salvation.

I was given the opportunity to disciple this new convert. Peter began to come to discipleship class faithfully each Wednesday. As we worked through the lessons, he displayed eagerness to learn more Bible. We discussed salvation and eternal security, then he went back to the village for Christmas break. Upon returning to Mbarara for school he resumed discipleship classes. I was able to teach him about baptism and

We began 2015 with a handful of people, joining us for a New Years Eve Service. Together we prayed as the clock ticked midnight. Afterward, we watched as the world celebrated their tradition of burning the 'old' man (a literal burning of a stuffed dummy), as the 'new' year begins. This year we began a youth activity every Saturday, and plan once a month, to take our group to Merida, to join another church in their youth activities. For our Te-kax teens, I think they need to see there are other Christian teens. On the first trip, Moses (seen in photo-watching arm wrestling), bowed his head and prayed to receive the Lord! In February, this special Saturday was replaced with a youth conference in Cancun. Our teens enjoyed it thoroughly!

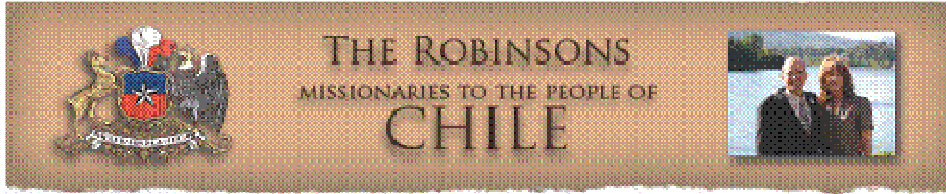

The Naal family in particular, after their mother passed away, asked us to sing at the evening wake, when she arrived home, and the funeral the next day. THE ROBINSONS 1-2015

Our first report of the new calendar year comes to you from Pensacola FL, where, by the grace, mercy, and provision of God poured abundantly upon us in response to your prayers, we have finally "crash landed" safely and "set up shop" to begin "picking up the pieces." Switching metaphors to something more "positive," if our return to Chile were likened to a mountain climbing expedition (and after dealing with our truck and trailer these past 16 months, I don't believe it would be stretching the metaphor too far), this would be our Main Base Camp, with the longed-for Summit representing our arrival back in Valdivia. The LORD has greatly used Bible Baptist Church and the brethren here in the accomplishment of this interim objective, which now facilitates the crucial step of eliminating unnecessary dead weight - I refer of course, to the truck and trailer (Hebrews 12:1b), the divestiture of which will not just be critical strategic maneuver; but also cause for great personal relief and encouragement (I say the truth, and lie not, my conscience also bearing me witness, etc.). We have already moved out into temporary lodgings (made available to us by a brother here who has been a friend and partner of the Lord's ministry through us in Chile from the very beginning), and LORD willing, the vehicles now enter into the process of being made "marketable" and sold; this will be extensive and costly, for the which cause we urge you to continue praying for us along that line (and all others, of course). While that's underway, as the LORD permits, we will also have some presentation meetings in the immediate area, and I'm hoping to be able to pick up a bit of independent work "on the side" to offset some of the economic necessity and speed the whole process along; we desire your prayers in all this as well. Also, and by way of reminder, please continue in prayer regarding the printing project of the Spanish Bible (I mention this in our October 2014 letter), as well as for our home church and its Valera Bible Society ministry in general - some very important decisions will be deliberated and determined over the course of the next month or so, now that the LORD has installed Bro. Richard Barnett as our church's new pastor (thank you for having prayed for the church in that regard), leading up to this year's Spanish Bible Conference there in Miami in early March. Let it be said yet again that your faithful sustenance of our "Christian ambassadorship" in Chile - in prayer, finance, and myriad other unmentioned forms - is highly regarded and valued by us, as a very present, continuous encouragement and succor in our "looking unto Jesus" that we too might be found faithful in Him. We'd also like to include here an additional note of appreciation to all who sent extra end-of-the-year monetary gifts; for most, it's simply an additional year-end gift that you give to all your missionaries, but in our case it's proven especially helpful in light of the financial debacle in which we find ourselves at the end of this furlough. The LORD knows who you are, and that your giving is from the heart, and will reward accordingly at the Judgment Seat of Christ; there's not much we can add to or take away from that (except perhaps Paul's prayer in 2 Timothy 1 :18), but we say "Thank You," in any event.

It's peak summer in southern Chile, so the brethren from the 2 churches had their annual baptismal outing, this time opting for the fresh, clean mountain river waters outside of the Andean foothills town of Lifen, where Camila, the young lady that had gotten saved back in October, gave public testimony in the physical waters of her having personally "taken of the water of life" and been spiritually baptized into Christ's Body when she called upon the LORD last year. She has continued faithful with the Cayumapu church and is growing spiritually, according to her pastor (Raul); thank you for having prayed for her. While there, the opportunity for public ministry was not to be missed - this town continues to be a part of the Itinerant Public Ministry Circuit we established, and we remain hopeful of its someday being home to a Bible Believing local church - and so praise the LORD for saving one young man's soul in response to the street preaching and personal work evangelizing [apologies for not remembering his name after Raul had told me]. Regarding the trip to Punta Arenas mentioned in our last 2 prayer letters, nothing has come of it yet, as the brother who was facilitating the whole affair has, well, basically "disappeared," at least from communications with the brethren of the 2 churches. Now, Bro. Luis had been having some serious health issues while traveling back and forth, so it may be related to that, but neither the police nor the hospitals have any record of him; there is the possibility of soulish "health problems" (i.e.: gone A.W.O.L.), but until we receive some kind of definitive information, please do pray for him. Ending this report on a lighter note, I sure hope all this has nothing to do with me asking you last month to pray for the trip being delayed until I could get back to Chile and go with them! Thank you for continuing to read these letters and stand with us spiritually; LORD bless you all.

Brethren,

This New Year has brought us some needs that I would like to let you know about as we end our second furlough and make our way back to Tapalpa, Mexico. We had planned to head for the border in the middle of February but at the end of January our Mexican-plated van lost its engine. Due to our permanent resident visa and the Mexican law concerning vehicles our van must return to Mexico "dead or alive". We have decided to repair the van with the help of some brethren in our home church. Thankfully the Lord has provided the money for the cost of the engine through some churches we have visited during our delay return to Mexico. We also have nearly \$600 more in parts remaining to finish the job. I am reminded of our Lord's promise in Matthew 7:7, "Ask, and it shall be given you; seek, and ye shall find; knock, and it shall be opened unto you:" We have taken it to the Lord, and I believe you who read our letters need to know of the financial needs we have at this time. "For His mercy endureth forever."

As you may know, we came out on furlough to seek medical attention for Abigail's absence seizures and that Timothy broke his arm. With these and other medical expenses we have an out of pocket medical debt of nearly \$10,000. At this time we are seeking a discount (or better) for these medical bills. "For His mercy endureth forever."

Praise the Lord for new churches taking us on for support and a support-
