The Difference Between an Ordination and a Pastorate

From time to time, there is confusion about the title of "Pastor." It is because a man who is ordained is called pastor by those who feel uncomfortable addressing him as "Reverend" or "Minister." It seems to roll off the tongue easier as: "Hello pastor John" rather than "Hello reverend John." So, people commonly wrongly call an ordained minister: "pastor."

When graduating Bible institute, a Preacher Boy is bestowed a title which is recorded on his Ordination certificate. The title given to me is: "Reverend." Following this example, I in turn bestowed the title of "Reverend" upon the men who I have trained in the ministry. Pastor is not a title bestowed upon anyone who completes a Bible training program.

A pastor is a position in the church. The Greek word "poimen" is translated as "pastor." It defines: "the presiding officer, manager, director, of any assembly; the overseer of Christian assemblies. Noah Webster's 1828 dictionary says a pastor is: "A minister of the gospel who has the charge of a church and congregation, whose duty is to watch over the people of his charge, and instruct them in sacred doctrines of Christian religion." In the New Testament, the word "pastor" is found only one time. In Ephesians 4:11-12 we are told that

pastors are given to us for the perfecting of the saints, the work of the ministry and the edifying of the body of Christ.

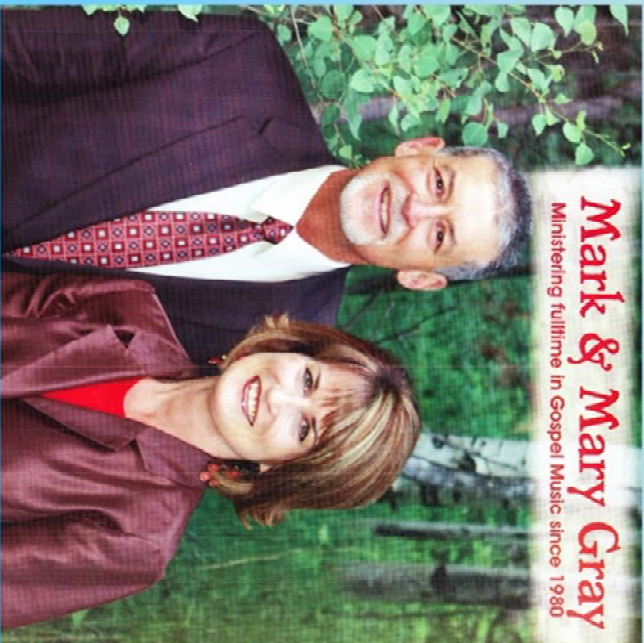
In every church there is only one pastor. Although people refer to the council of Apostles seen in Acts chapters 1-3 when they champion that churches have a council of pastors, but they are wrong. Why? Because there is a huge difference between Apostles and Pastors. There are no pastors being mentioned in Acts 1-3. There are only Apostles being mentioned. There can be many Apostles, but each church can have only one pastor.

So, an ordained minister (Reverend) is not necessarily a pastor. He is only a pastor if he is employed by a church to lead the congregation as outlined in accordance with that churches constitution and in accordance with Ephesians 4:12 and the books of 1 & 2 Timothy and Titus. Unfortunately there are some churches who employ pastors who have never been ordained, and that is okay as long as they still meet the above requirements (That is if it is to be a Christian church). Even if they are not ordained, but they are employed by the church they have the title of "pastor." On the other hand, just because they are ordained, does not mean they automatically become a "pastor."

Assistant pastors have the same commission as the pastor, but they are under the authority of the pastor

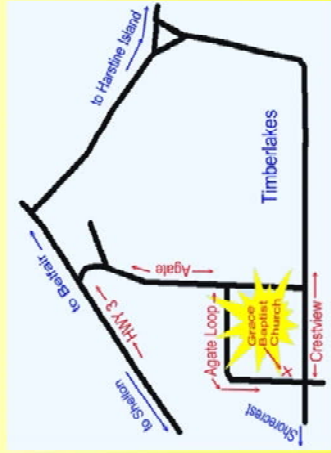

at all times. They have no authority, but they have the commission.

Pastors assistants are not pastors, nor must they be ordained. They are personal assistants to the pastor (not the congregation). Sometimes they are called: "secretaries", "administrators", "teachers" or "office workers." Pastors employ them to assist them with their personal work and to train them by being in close association with him. To better understand the relationship of those he

is training, think of it as an apprenticeship.

With patience, persistence and prayer, Charles Wasilausky will be the first to complete the apprenticeship program. But, he will need prayer. The devil would love nothing more than to destroy Charles and make him ineffective. I don't anticipate that for Him, but the devil always has a way of getting at the authority structure of a Christian who is called.~
