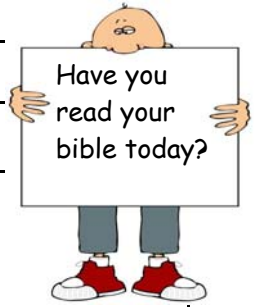

Christianity: The worlds problem

The violence, rebellion and polarization that we see today, in increased intensity, is not because of racism, feminism, politics, culture, education, security or unemployment. These are certainly problems in the immediate, but they are the unwanted products of a much larger problem; a problem that ties them all together. The problem of today is Christianity. Emil Durkheim, the French social Darwinian said about religion, "...it is the glue that holds society together." Karl Marx said about religion, "It is the opium of the people." These are two examples where even unbelievers recognize that religion is common to all men.

Of all the religions of the world, Christianity stands out. It is the only one where the head of it is God, the creator of all things. It is the only one where the Creator came down to earth to redeem man. Religion is man's attempt to reach God; Christianity is Gods attempt to reach man. Because it stands so unique, it receives much condemnation.

The world absolutely hates Jesus Christ! It hates Jesus because He reveals it for what it really is (John 7:7). The same is true today. People don't even want to get to know Him. They hate Him without knowing anything about Him (John 15:25; Psalm 109:3). They just know that they hate Him. They don't know why they hate Him. They don't want to know why they hate Him. They just hate Him! AND, they hate Him with such an intense hatred that they hate those who love Him as well.

The world is and has been full of hate since the time that Cain killed Abel. All the initial problems I listed are the offspring of hate that begins with hating Jesus. Man doesn't see himself as the

problem. He doesn't hate himself (Eph. 5:29). He hates others (Titus 3:3), especially if the love God.

I recently wrote a post about the Bible on Facebook that accidentally got put on the Mason County News group. I didn't know that it was there. The next day when I checked my Facebook account, I had all of these replies to my post from the Mason County News group. It turned into a 45+ reply argument. People were calling me the worst names you could imagine. They were speaking for me, confident that they knew how I thought about a matter, as well as the intentions of my heart. I was surprised as to how instantaneously people hated and judged me for one little accident. Even after I explained it was a mistake people continued with their verbal bullying. It seemed like there was a line drawn in the sand with one group hating me and another defending me. Neither group knew me. It showed me how quickly the world can be divided, and upon thinking about it, I realized the world doesn't divide quickly at all—it is already divided. It has been divided for thousands of years.

On the Georgia Guidestones in Elbert County, Georgia are written inscriptions by those whom seek a new age of reason (a "one world" set of rules.). The first inscription calls for the maintenance of humanity to remain under 500 million people in a perpetual balance with nature. This would mean that the world would have to get rid of 6.3 trillion people. That is a lot of people that needs to go. When contemplating how they would expect to do this, I thought of priorities. The elderly would go first (euthanasia). The babies would go second (abortion). Then they would start on the groups that they hate the most—Christians. Applying this to Christian knowledge I see Je-

The Lord has blessed us with a baby boy! The expected due date is July 30th. Please pray that all will go according to the Lord’s will and that we will have a safe and healthy delivery. We are looking to have the child overseas so please pray that we find the Lord’s will regarding a hospital/doctor. A Broken Window is an Open Window—Recently, we were out to eat with a Pastor after Sunday evening service. We had a good time of fellowship. After dinner, we got into our vehicle and realized that our back window had been busted out. We realized that some thieves had busted it and had stolen our projector bag and small suitcase. While these things are going to be missed, the Lord was so good to protect the more valuable things in the vehicle. Our other electronics were not even touched. Praise the Lord! What was also a blessing was that one of the employees of the restaurant that was helping us with this matter, was a young man by the name of Edward

that had come from Turkey about 14 months ago. Edward comes from a Muslim family—but was not a devout Muslim. He really had no knowledge of Christianity and seemed disillusioned with Islam. Throughout our conversation, He kept mentioning about how calm we were responding to this matter. He could not understand why we didn't appear angry. To his questions, I spoke about how our God is in control and He has a reason for why He allows things to happen. I shared that many things happen because mankind are sinners. I shared with him different parts of the gospel—which was all new to him. I gave him a couple tracts which he promised he would read. Towards the end of our conversation, I found out he had lost his grandmother back in Turkey the day before. No doubt, he is thinking and questioning. Please pray that the Lord would work in Edward's heart.

God opens doors that no man can close—literally! This week we have had more unexpected car issues. Last week, I went out to open our rear door and the latch would not engage/lock. I couldn't close the door! The local auto parts dealers didn't carry the part and they told me that it was a dealer part. This meant that I had to travel 175 miles one way to go to the dealership. I called the dealer and I set up an appointment. We traveled down and the man that greeted me was named Christian. I commented on his name and I inquired about his spiritual condition. We chatted a little bit more and I gave him a gospel tract. About 90 minutes later, I was informed that they didn't have the part that they had previously told me they had. (Feeling "a little" frustrated on the inside) I was then told that they still had 20 minutes of work to do—so I went and waited some more. About 20 minutes later, I walked up to the desk to check on the car and I noticed that Christian was intently reading the tract—so much so that he didn't even recognize that I was there for a good 3-4 minutes. Finally, he looks up and says "Wow...it's really just faith isn't it". He then said, "I thought I was doing all these good things and I was wrong." He told me that just the other week, he was thinking about these things and had many questions. I shared some more about the Gospel—he was working, so I couldn't spend a lot of time. I asked him if he had a Bible. He told me that he didn't have one. I asked him if I would get him one, would he read it and he told me absolutely. I told him that God cares about him and has a purpose for his life. I shared how it was not coincidence that our car latch stopped working. He was simply blown away at the thought that God orchestrated/allowed events so that he could hear the gospel. We got him a Bible, I wrote down a good number of verses that helped with showing someone how to be saved. When I walked back into the dealership, he had the biggest smile on his face, and he thanked me over and over for sharing and giving him the Bible. While, our back latch did not get fixed and we seemingly drove 350 miles for nothing—it was not a waste, it was obviously a divine appointment. Did Christian get saved? I don't know.

February, 2019

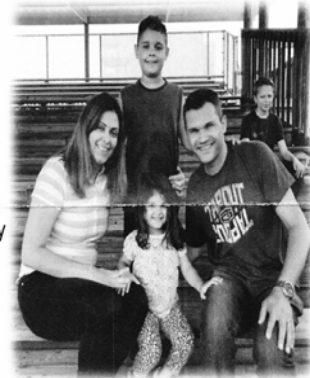

What I do know is that this was another piece of the puzzle in bringing Christian to Christ. Please pray that Christian will read, understand, and ultimately put his complete faith in Christ for salvation—if he didn't believe the other day. Some plant, some water, but God gives the increase. Since then our car latch has been fixed—and it was under warranty—Praise the Lord!

Training those going to the uttermost—I have a unique opportunity that has been presented to me for when we return. In addition to those we are already training, I have 24 additional men from a very remote region that are desiring training. These men are from areas that are comprised of several unreached people groups/villages that have never been touched with the gospel. They have a desire to receive training so that they can go back and work to reach some of these groups. I have been to some of these very remote mountain villages and there is such a need for churches to be planted—but that starts with men being properly trained. Please pray that the Lord would give me wisdom for the both the logistical and financial dynamics. Most of these men are very poor and don't have the ability to take care of their training expenses. Please pray that these laborers who are desiring and called to go to the harvest field would be adequately prepared and equipped for the work. We know that the Lord is more than able.

We greatly appreciate all your faithful prayers and financial support. We count it an honor to co-labor with you and to serve our Lord. You are continually in our thoughts and prayers. May the Lord bless you as you serve Him in your mission field.
